


- Topic RUR-16-2017

- May 2018 – October 2021 (5 Mio Euro)
- 17 Partners in 15 countries, EU plus NO, CH
- Female coordinating team, 3 workpackages led by men (9WPs)
- Strong representation of Eastern EU countries:
HU, RO, BG, PL
- Ethics committee and gender delegate

- To make a significant and meaningful contribution to optimising interactive innovation projects, networks and initiatives

- the delivery of EU policies to speed up innovation in agriculture, forestry and rural areas.


Workprogramme (1)

- WP1: Conceptual framework, and common understanding
- WP2: How we work together
- WP3: 'Light-touch review' of 200 projects and initiatives funded by H2020, RDP, national/regional programs, private engagement
- WP4: in-depth assessment of 32 interactive innovation projects (four non-EU)




... workprogramme (2)

- WP5: Testing methods used for assessing the effectiveness and impact of interactive innovation approaches
- WP6: Integration of findings and synthesis of recommendations.
- WP7: Bringing target groups to the project, and dissemination of results
- WP8: Coordination, communication, management
- WP9: Ethics with GDPR related requirements and gender
