



## **CAP** negotiations

- Trilogues ongoing (EP, Council, EC)

### - CAP Strategic Plans regulation:

- Cross-cutting objective (Art 5)
- Farm Advisory Services (Art. 13)
- Cooperation (Art. 71) this afternoon
- Knowledge exchange and information (Art. 72), including support for advice and training based on the AKIS strategy *this afternoon*
- Modernisation: AKIS and digitalisation (Art. 102)
- CAP networks (Art. 113)
- EIP OGs (Art. 114)
- Indicative timeline for agreement: first semester 2021
- CAP Strategic Plans to be submitted formally to the Commission by 1/1/2022

# CAP post 2020 – AKIS, EIP, advice and innovation – state of play negotiations (1)

### **Council Working : AKIS related discussions finalised:**

MS are overall happy with Commission proposal, including:

- Continuation of support for preparing and implementing OG innovative projects, as well as for EIP networking (Art 113,114)
- Higher than normal EU co-funding for OG projects (up to 80%), (OGs in average 150-200.000 euro)
- Possibility of advance payments for OG projects (up to 50%)
- **Principles of interactive innovation now explicit in regulation** (as in 2014 EIP guidelines):
  - 1) focus on practical farmers' needs
  - 2) co-creation and co-decision all along the project
  - 3) complementary knowledge in the OG necessary: farmers' involvement is key

(Idem Horizon 2020 WP page 11-13, and Horizon Europe)

=> Do not underestimate the enterpreneurial creativity of farmers in OG projects for innovation, e.g. IE example of an OG testing and preparing an Agri-Environmental measure (AKIS report: see bo

# CAP post 2020 – AKIS, EIP, advice and innovation – state of play negotiations (2)

- Obligation to integrate and **update advisors' competences through connections within the AKIS** (Art 13), e.g. on up-to-date R&I and economic, ecological and social domains
- Obligation and funding to provide innovation support (Art 13)
- Broad CAP support for almost any type of knowledge exchange and advice (Art 72)
  Iimitations in former FAS, as well as in Art 15 advisory support in current RD regulation

### A number of <u>further improvements</u> since June 1018:

Art 3: definition of AKIS

Art 72: coherence: linking the support for knowledge exchange & advice with AKIS strategies Art 114: introduction of funding cross-border OG projects (as from the start) Art 113: introduction of the possibility for existing OGs to cooperate, funded by Technical Assistance or Art 72 => CROSS-FERTILISATION

**European Parliament:** compromise amendments voted on 2/4/2019: no substantial changes

New Parliament: positive, no substantial changes

## **EU's long-term vision for rural areas**



✓ **315 projects** – EUR 1,9 billion under Horizon 2020

- 190 H2020 multi-actor projects (EUR 1 billion), including 34 thematic networks; 50% newcomers
- ✓ 27 Member States implementing the EIP; over 2000 out of 3200 OGs already running



 A growing and thriving network and increasing volume of practice-oriented knowledge and innovations: challenge to manage interaction, communication and dissemination







## Encouraging synergies within the EU and globally



- <u>Next Work Programme 2023-2024</u>: large-scale R&I partnerships with the Member States and Associated Countries
  - Animal health and welfare
  - Agriculture of data
  - Agro-ecology living labs and research infrastructure
- Circular Bio-based Europe (CBE)  $\rightarrow$  more attention for primary producers
- EU-Africa R&I Partnership on Food and Nutrition Security and Sustainable Agriculture (FNSSA) and EU-China FAB
- International research consortia (IRC):
  - Star Idaz on animal health
  - a new IRC in the area of soil and carbon
- Cooperation with the Global Research Alliance on Agriculture Greenhouse Gases (GRA)

- The subject of this call for tenders is to provide strategic analysis and support for enhanced research cooperation in agriculture and food
- The services are specific to support the different Working Groups , notably the Strategic Working Groups (SWGs), the Collaborative Working Groups (CWGs) and the Foresight Group
- Main tasks:
- 1. Portfolio Analysis of research and innovation projects at national, regional and EU level in the domain of the Working Groups, in preparation of the meetings
- 2. Support to the different SCAR Working Groups:
- for the organization of all Working Group meetings
- communication and support tasks to the different Working Groups (minutes, ppts,...)





## Future animation of SCAR Strategic Working Groups (SWG) – tender published

1 coordinator + at least 8 experts in the fields of the SWGs:

- One expert in agricultural knowledge and innovation systems (SWG SCAR AKIS),
- One expert in food systems, including nutrition, dietary shifts, food losses and waste, value chains and consumers/citizens aspects,
- One expert in fisheries and aquaculture,
- One expert in agroecology,
- One expert in bioeconomy,
- One expert in forestry systems, including agroforestry aspects,
- One expert in sustainable animal production and health,
- One expert in global challenges linked to agriculture and food systems including environment, climate and biodiversity related aspects and EU- Africa challenges.
