

What are the main characteristics of your national AKIS? SWOT Analysis

• Strengths:

- → Awareness of the key role of training, advisory system, digitalisation and innovation for the future of the sector and rural areas
- → Good results of EIP-Agri measure despite the difficulties of implementation and coordination
- ightarrow High number of initiatives related to digitisation of the sector at national and regional level
- → Existence of farmers organisations and settled structures which can enhance AKIS development

Opportunities

- → Agrifood Competitiveness improvement if training is adapted to sector needs
- → Wide territorial coverage regarding education and training
- → Evolution of advisory system to a multidisciplinary point of view, with a strong role of advisor in AKIS


Weaknesses

- → Complex implementation of measures 1, 2 and EIP-Agri
- → Low innovation investment below pre-economic crisis level
- → Weak coordination among different agents and levels, absence of an integrated information and monitoring system at national level.
- → Knowledge generated does not reach the end user or its implementation remains incomplete

Threats

- → Loss of practical knowledge due to lack of person to person exchange
- → Low interoperability of digital tools
- → Low connexion between AKIS can lead to scattered and lost of knowledge



- Coordinated regional and national interventions policy level discussion-.
- Ministry of Agriculture is focused on coordination and subsidiary support
 - FairShare and i2Connect participation
 - Focus Group on Advisors within AKIS: analysis and improvement of the role of advisors, paths of evolution, training needs, improvement of their role in AKIS at national level

• What are the main CAP interventions you plan for your national AKIS with regard to:

→ Focus on target groups (S&M farmers, women, young farmers)

- a. Enhancing knowledge flows and strengthening links between research and practice:
 - National farm demonstration network, funding setting up, travelling costs and demonstration activities
 - Networking activities among AKIS actors: meetings and workshops (targeted issues)
 - Regional inverventions ... local innovation centres?
- b. Strengthening farm advisory services within the AKIS



AKIS ADVISORS PLATFORM

- Support for national and regional interventions
- Host or link regional platforms (on demand)
- c. Strengthening interactive innovation and EIP OGs
 - EIP Agri cooperation: more budget (national level), better management (working with regional managers to set up common elements)

- What are the main CAP interventions you plan for your national AKIS with regard to:
- d. Supporting digital transition in agriculture
 - Training in digital skills for producers and advisors
 - Boost of Open
 - •Financial support for digital entrepeneurs in the agri-food sector
- Any issues with the budget needed to come to a good result?
 - The distribution of funds between regions and ministry is still to be decided at political level.

- Non interventions but still part of AKIS at CAP SP:
 - Platform (recovery funds-timeline)
 - Innovation workshops (targeted knowledge Exchange, H2020 actors)
 - Follow up of funded innovations, market approach, impact
 - Governance: coordination unit-ministries involved-regions-relevant actors
 - Agrifood-Digital competences centre: agreement with Universities
 - Financial suport for Agrifood companies developments based on innovation
 - Setting up of an Agrifood DIH within the Ministry's premises
 - BigMAPA Project: Agrifood open data
 - Digital uptake obervatory (Agrifood sector)

.... SPANISH DIGITAL STRATEGY FOR THE AGRIFOOD SECTOR (2019)

All based on Focus Group Advisory within AKIS recommendations:

- Strategic approach: improvement of the coordination at national (other Ministries) and regional (with Spanish regions) level
- Governance: taking advantages of existing actions and mechanisms at regional at sectorial level to made them part of the national governance
- Maintenance of FEADER measures 1, 2 and 16 (training and information, advisory and cooperation)
 - → Streamlining of management procedures
- Improvement of structure and knowledge of advisory system:
 - →Room for every advisor interested
 - → Respect to impartiality and quality of the advice
 - →Establishment of a platform for knowledge Exchange and coordination among advisors
- Reinforce of the network effect: multi-actor events → Exchange of sector needs and R&D results
- Boost demonstrative actions, → National network of demonstrative holdings. Access to R&D and bussines
- Focus on target groups: → Specific actions for groups less represented in AKIS (S&M farmers, women, young farmers)
 - → Inclusion of distributions, consumers and society
- Reconnect and reinforce the triangle Science-Innovation-Education (Vocational training and long-lasting training)
- Enhance peer learning.
- Strengthen interaction among AKIS' actors: → development of trust connexions, foster innovation ecosystem
